



Humboldt Collegiate Institute Academic Honour Roll & Proficiency Award Calculation Criteria

The following criteria will be used when calculating a student's average at each grade level:

- Final marks from Semester One (Term 2) and midterm marks from Semester Two (Term 3) will be used to calculate averages.
- Final marks for credits taken outside of HCI (distance education, online courses) can be used, provided they have been obtained during the current school year and the mark is a final mark from semester one or a midterm mark from semester two; at least 50 % of an online course must be completed to qualify
- Non-credit courses (10, 20 or 30 level) cannot be used
- Averages will NOT be rounded off
- Grade 10, 11 or 12 students taking fewer than 8 credit courses per year are considered to be part-time students and do not qualify for the Honour Roll or Academic Proficiency Awards.
- All awards calculated after June 30 will use the student's transcripts for the calculations. The students best 30 level mark will always be used regardless of the year the course was taken in.
- Plagiarism, and any other form of cheating, will disqualify the student from the Honour Roll, a Proficiency Award, and school-selected scholarships.
- To qualify for the Honour Roll and Proficiency Awards a student must be registered as a student at HCI in June of the current year.
- All awards criteria and information are accurate as of the date of posting.

Grade 11

- English Language Arts 20
- Mathematics (The highest grade in a mathematics class at the 20 level)

 - Foundations of Mathematics 20
 - Pre-Calculus 20
- Science (The highest grade in a science class at the 20 level)
 - Environmental Science 20
 - Health Science 20
 - Physical Science 20
- Next highest elective from our Fine Arts or Practical and Applied Arts
- Next three highest academic electives (taken from the areas of math, science, and social science courses) at the 20 or 30 level.

Grade 12

- English Language Arts A30
- English Language Arts B30
- History 30
- Mathematics (The highest grade in a mathematics class at the 30 level)
 - Workplace and Apprenticeship Mathematics 30
 - Foundations of Mathematics 30
 - Pre-Calculus 30
 - Calculus 30
- Science (The highest grade in a science class at the 30 level)
 - Environmental Science 30
 - Chemistry 30
 - Biology 30
 - Physics 30
- Next two highest electives at the 30 level (taken from the areas of math, science, social science, fine arts, and practical and applied arts). A maximum of ONE fine arts/practical applied arts may be used.
