

## Grade 5-12 Ice Fishing

Location:	Lucien Lake
Date:	Friday, March 19th
Time:	<p><b>Grades 7-12</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 11am - 2:30pm, returning to school by 3pm for dismissal</li> </ul> <p><b>Grades 5-6</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 12:30pm - 2:30pm, returning to school by 3pm for dismissal</li> </ul>
Permissions:	Parents signed high risk activity forms at the beginning of the year. If this activity was not checked off for your child he or she will remain at the school to complete school work.
Licences:	<p>We have been supplied with a special permit from the Ministry of Environment's fisheries branch. This allows students who are 16+ to fish without purchasing their own license. <b>Students who fall into this category cannot take fish home. They must release the fish.</b></p> <p>Students who are 16+ and have a fishing licence, and students 15 years old or younger can take fish home. They must follow all existing laws.</p>
Supplies:	<p>Students are encouraged to bring their own fishing supplies if they have either a small rod, ice fishing rod, or another option (stick and line), tackle suitable for ice fishing, bait (if they wish), and a small cushion to sit on to help keep dry. <b>NO KNIVES.</b> Scissors or nail clippers can be used to cut fishing line. <b>Don't have fishing supplies?</b> There will be extra rods and tackle made available for students who do not have these supplies.</p> <p>Three or four grocery or ziploc bags to transport fish home.</p> <p>Dress for the weather.</p> <p>Water bottle and a small snack. Garbage is taken off of the lake. Grades 7-12 will pack a lunch and eat on the lake. Garbage will be taken home.</p> <p>Sunblock</p>
Fish filleting:	Fish will not be filleted/cleaned at the lake. Students will take fish home to clean/fillet.
Transporting equipment & Fish:	Ms. Connolly and Mr. Rung are both okay with supplies being brought to school on the bus. They are also okay with fish being transported home on the bus. Please ensure you have given permission to your child to bring fish home. We want to ensure the fish will not go to waste as fish are a valuable Saskatchewan resource.
Safety:	<p>We need to consider the following to have a safe and joyful day:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Lake ice and open water (if any)</li> <li>- Fish hooks</li> <li>- Fishing rods</li> <li>- Sunburns (risk increases with sunlight reflecting off the snow/ice)</li> </ul>
Student behaviour:	Students must behave in a way that allows themselves and others to be safe, as well as to allow others to enjoy the experience. If students are showing signs that they are needing to return to the school we will have a teacher return to the school with them where they can complete school work for the remainder of the day.
