Students are welcome to bring their own lunches and snacks or purchase food and drinks at the hill.

All students must have proper winter clothing (toques, mitts, ski pants, jacket, extra dry clothing, etc.) for the day.

Parents are welcome to come to the hill for the day and join in! Rental rates for parents are \$23 for a lift ticket, \$10 for ski rental, \$22 for snowboard rental, and \$7 for a group lesson. If you are a parent and are planning on attending, please **DO NOT** pay the school. Please pay at the hill.

Please **READ, COMPLETE IN FULL**, and **RETURN** the attached Parent/Guardian Consent Form, the Student Info form (one form **per** student), and payment (made payable to Three Lakes School) to Ms. Krentz at the office **NO LATER THAN 9 A.M. on FRIDAY, MARCH 16, 2018**. At this time, a decision will be made whether or not the trip will go ahead depending on the number of paid students. Late registrations **WILL NOT** be accepted!!

Downhill skiing and snowboarding are approved activities in the Saskatchewan curriculum under Physical and Outdoor Education. It is expected that all students participate and take advantage of this educational opportunity.

Also, in order for a student to participate in this activity, they **MUST** have returned their Horizon School Division High Risk Activity Annual Informed Consent Form to the school.

If there is any misbehavior from your child, you may have to come and get them at the hill that day.

PARENT/GUARDIAN CONSENT FORM

Three Lakes (School) is arranging a trip for students to come to Wapiti Valley Ski & Board Resort. This signed form is required for all students who wish to participate in either the skiing or snowboarding education program. It should be understood that the purpose of this program is educations. **Lessons are mandatory.**

INHERENT RISK: Skiing and/or snowboarding are sports with physical and inherent risks which are beyond the control of Wapiti Valley Ski & Board Resort.

Falls, collisions and other incidents may occur and cause injury. Participants will assume the inherent risk of the sport. Following all rules and procedures can reduce the risk of injury. Failure to follow rules will result in the student losing their lift ticket and future resort privileges.

EQUIPMENT: Wapiti Valley Ski & Board Resort provides rental equipment. Bindings on ski equipment reduce the risk of injury when falling. They will not release under all circumstance and they do not guarantee safety in all cases. Parents/Guardians must accept responsibility for equipment that is lost or damaged (other than reasonable wear and tear).

ALPINE RESPONSIBILITY CODE: (See page 2) The ski industry has produces a Responsibility Code which Wapiti Valley requires that you know and obey. Skiers/Snowboarders must always be in control and able to stop and change direction to avoid collisions with people or objects. Wapiti Valley may revoke a lift ticket for violation of the code or other unacceptable conduct.

PARENT/GUARDIAN CONSENT FORM *Continued*


All students must be classified according to the following guide.

- GREEN** Ski or Board 0 – 3 times.
Introduction to skiing or snowboarding. Lessons designed for first time or riders who need practice of basic skills
- BLUE** Ski or Board 4 – 10 times.
Riders who can turn both ways in snowplow or sideslip and come to a controlled stop.
- BLACK** 11+ times.
Skiers or Snowboarders who can parallel ski, or carve both ways on a snowboard. This will be Black Diamond runs and will challenge the riders' skills.

We strongly suggest that students go in the level that suits their ability and not that of their friends.

All students **MUST** take a lesson, there are no exceptions. Loss of lift tickets may happen if students miss their lesson.

ALPINE RESPONSIBILITY CODE

<p>1 Always stay in control. You must be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.</p> <p>2 People ahead of you have the right-of-way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.</p> <p>3 Do not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.</p> <p>4 Before starting downhill or merging onto a trail, look uphill and yield to others.</p> <p>5 If you are involved in or witness a collision or accident, you must remain at the scene and identify yourself to the Ski Patrol.</p>	<p>6 Always use proper devices to prevent runaway equipment.</p> <p>7 Observe and obey all posted signs and warnings.</p> <p>8 Keep off closed trails and closed areas.</p> <p>9 You must not use lifts or terrain if your ability is impaired through use of alcohol or drugs.</p> <p>10 You must have sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to safely load, ride and unload lifts. If in doubt, ask the lift attendant.</p>
